## IS YOUR STUDENT READY FOR SENIOR YEAR?

## \*You MUST have the following in order to attend school Senior Year!!

To all parents/guardians of 11<sup>th</sup> grade students,

Please be aware of the required **2nd dose** of MCV4 (meningitis ACWY) which is given AFTER the age of 16 (the first would have been given before 8th grade), that is required in order to pick up schedules and/or to ATTEND SCHOOL for 12<sup>th</sup> grade.

\*\*Please turn this in by the end of this school year in order to prevent any delays with schedule pick up in August. You may have your student bring this in, fax it or email it to me at any time.

\*\*Per the health department, we can NO LONGER accept proof of an appointment in order to attend.

Per Missouri State Law, we MUST have this immunization record (or proper documentation of a medical or religious exemption) on file in order for your student to attend.

\*\*Students who do not have this will NOT be allowed to pick up their schedule and/or WILL BE SENT HOME ON THE FIRST DAY OF SCHOOL.

If your student has had the second dose of MCV4, please turn in a copy to the SCW clinic. If your student still needs this vaccine, you can contact your medical provider or any pharmacy to obtain this immunization. If you do not have insurance coverage for this, you may contact the St. Charles County Health Department at (636) 949-1857 for an appointment.
