In collaboration with the St. Charles County Public Health Department and government, the City of St. Charles School District will be closed Monday, March 16th through April 3rd. As of now, our scheduled return date for students will be April 6th. However, we will continue to evaluate this situation with the St. Charles County Public Health Department and government in the coming weeks to ensure a safe environment before students and staff return. In addition to schools being closed, all after school events/activities and facility usage are canceled until April 6th as well.

Information on our instructional support plan for while students are at home and food distribution for our families in need will be sent out as soon as possible. While the schools are closed to the public, we will be deep cleaning and disinfecting all of the areas students and staff utilize, including buses.

With this closure brings questions and an unprecedented time. Our first priority is to make sure our students, staff, and community are safe. Thank you for your trust, support, and understanding as we navigate this uncharted territory together. We will continue to communicate with you fully as we move forward.

We want to again provide both the established hotlines for the State of Missouri and St. Charles County to manage calls about coronavirus.
