PHONES

Cell phones are not to be out during the school day. Once the bell rings at 7:20am, they **must** be silenced/turned off and put away.

The Student Handbook & District Code of Conduct Manual states the following on page 41 for failure to turn off and put away phones:

FIRST OFFENSE: Your phone is confiscated by the teacher or staff member. The teacher contacts home. The device must be checked in and out of the front office for 10 days.

SECOND OFFENSE: The device will be confiscated and must be collected by a parent or guardian. The teacher contacts home. The student could receive detentions. The device must be checked in and out of the office for 30 days.

REPEATED OFFENSES: The device is confiscated. The student could receive detentions or up to 3 days of ISS. The device will be checked in and out of the front office for up to the remainder of the school year.

DRESS CODE

(found on page 20 of The Student Handbook & District Code of Conduct Manual)

Students must dress appropriately for school. Clothing/attired should be conducive to an educational environment and should not be disruptive of school operations and the educational process.

- Pajamas/pajama pants are not considered school appropriate.
- Clothing must cover the front and the back of the student (backless tops, spaghetti straps, halter tops, and bare midriff, short shorts, as well as clothing that does not sufficiently cover the body are unacceptable at school).
- Footwear must be worn. Slippers are not considered school appropriate.
- Caps, hats, hoods and other head coverings (at the discretion of the principal) may not be worn or carried during the school day.
- Clothing which promotes the illegal or commercial use of drugs, alcohol, tobacco/nicotine products, gun/weapon paraphernalia and/or that includes sexual innuendo is not permitted.
- Gang related clothing may not be worn at school.
- Anything this is disruptive or interrupts the operation of the school day shall not be permitted.

Dress code violations (found on page 42):

FIRST OFFENSE: Parent contact and correction of violation

SECOND OFFENSE: Parent contact and correction of violation and possible detentions

REPEATED OFFENSES: Parent contact and correction of violated and possible detentions up to 3 days of ISS.
